Here at Hope, we are privileged to welcome visitors and guests in our worship services every single week. Our congregation has a warm, friendly vibe. OUR MISSIONARY FAMILY UPDATE

Hope member, Krista Young, will be working with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod Board for International Mission to serve as a missionary in Ethiopia. For the past 6 months, Krista has been fundraising and meeting with congregations all over the country. Krista, along with Joel, Sydney, and Grace, are happy to

announce they have been given the "green light" to move to Ethiopia. That means that they have reached a level in their network of support that can sustain the family's work in Addis. The goal is to move on August 2 in order to be in the country and have some time to adjust to the elevation and jet lag by August 9 when school starts for the girls. The family will continue to visit churches and ask for support. The green light does not mean that the need for support has gone away, or that they don't need ongoing gifts. WORK PERMIT. Ethiopia has a very rigorous process to obtain a work permit. Original documents need to be authenticated six different times before they are approved. This process can take many months and each step needs to be done exactly as directed. The Young family continues to work through the steps and pray that everything goes smoothly, that there are no major set backs that would push our entry into the country beyond our goal date.

- I will mess up. I'm far from perfect, but I hope when I do mess up you'll forgive me and we can work through it together.


I am really looking forward to this next year and getting to know everyone. I ask that you would pray for me and for the youth program at Hope.



The preschool has very limited openings in the Fall Preschool Program for 3 year olds. Contact the preschool for additional information (919-453-0388).


