# 7 & 8 GRADE MISSION TEAM AND HIGH SCHOOL SERVANT EVENT



In July, the High School Servant team traveled to Fayetteville, NC to help rebuild three homes that were destroyed/damaged during Hurricane Matthew. Each youth learned different skills as they literally worked from the top of a house to the bottom. While some youth worked on the subfloor, others re-shingled the roof. Our team was able to even put the finishing touches on one house allowing one home owner to move in!

In June, the 7 & 8 grade crew partner with YouthWorks in Taylorsville NC, for a week-long trip that puts youth to work in a different community with organizations who need the help. The team planned and ran a Kids Club program in the park, visited a senior nutrition program, cleared a Habitat for Humanity store warehouse, as well as beautified a few senior homes. The team worked extremely hard and many youths walked away with a new passion for work and service.





# **HOPE'S NEW TRAILER!**

Through a special grant received from the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod in 2018, Hope was able to purchase a new 6'x12' dual axle trailer. The eyecatching trailer will be used for disaster relief, mission trips, and Habitat for Humanity projects. Recently, it was used during the High School Servant event this summer in Fayetteville.

A team of Hope members have been working on building out the interior of the trailer to store the tools and supplies. Due to generous donations from ACE Hardware and the VBS service project, "Change for Change,"
